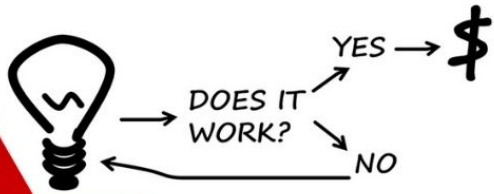

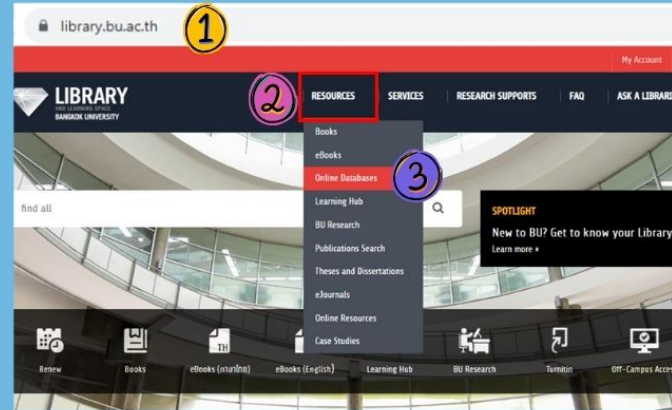

Search method

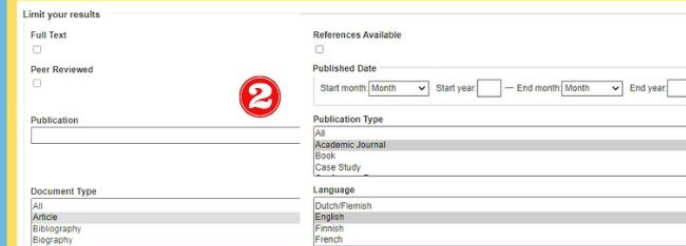
1. Basic Search

Abstract: In this article, we use a postcolonial management approach to exploring the lingering significance of colonialist images in shaping legal disputes between host country and foreign multinational corporations. We apply a similar discursive analysis to the Korean versus Samsung industrial espionage lawsuit, in which the Korean government accused a foreign multinational corporation of having its "national core technology." Through this analysis we demonstrate how industrial espionage discourse was used to fight Korea's regime reputation as a technological nation, possible Korea with global multinational leaders, and discourse used from other "industrial"
